#### About the Pianists



Matthias Fischer was born in 1973 in Bad Kissingen (Germany). He got his first piano-lessons from his parents at the age of 5. He studied piano for 1 year in Munich with Prof. Karl-Hermann Mrongovius. Between 1995 and 2002 he studied medicine in Würzburg. Since 2007 he is working as

a psychiatrist at the university hospital of Würzburg. After having finished his medical thesis about learning and memory in flies he is currently occupied with an MD/PhD-thesis about a form of mental retardation. In 1996 he won the 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in the 2<sup>nd</sup>, in 1998 the 3<sup>rd</sup> prize in the 3<sup>rd</sup> "International Students Piano Competition" in Utrecht. In 2000 he won the 1<sup>st</sup> prize in the 11<sup>th</sup> Les Concours de Grands Amateurs de Piano in Paris. In 2008 he won the 1<sup>st</sup> and the audience awards in the Berlin international piano amateur competition, playing Mendelssohn's d-minor piano-trio in the final. He gives concerts as soloist, chamber-musician and with orchestra: He played Haydn's piano-concerto in D-Major with the chamber – orchestra Wratislavia, Mozart's piano-concerto in d-minor KV 466 with the chamber – orchestra of the University of Würzburg and Cesar Francks Variations Symphoniques with the orchestre de la garde républicaine in Paris.

#### Vincent Schmithorst of Ohio, First Prize Winner, 2008 Festival of Music and the Sixth Washington International Piano Artists Competition

WIPAC proudly presents pianist Vincent Schmithorst of Ohio to perform music of Brahms, Chopin and Mozart. Vince is currently working at the Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center where he is using magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) technology to study how the brain processes sound in children with



unilateral hearing loss and auditory processing disorders, and is interested in the effect musical training in childhood may have on other cognitive domains such as math processing. He began his piano studies at the age of four and soloed with an amateur orchestra at the age of eight. At ten years of age, he was a soloist with the Cincinnati POPS Orchestra, and has since also played with the Cincinnati Symphony, Indianapolis Symphony, and Columbus Symphony Orchestras. He continued his studies at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, where he double-majored in piano performance and physics, graduating with a Bachelor's of Science and Bachelor's of Music at the age of eighteen. Subsequently he pursued doctoral studies in physics.

Vince continues to perform piano in solo recitals, and his awards include sixth prize in the American Music Scholarship Association World Piano Competition, and was a finalist and diploma-recipient in the first international Piano and Organ Competition held in Vilnius, Lithuania.



## ☐ Christopher Shih of Maryland, First Place Winner 2008 Les Concours des Grands Amateurs de Piano, Paris, France

Physician and pianist Christopher Shih has performed in major venues in over a dozen countries around the globe, including France, Germany, Austria, Hungary, Taiwan, and countless cities in the United States. He has soloed with numerous orchestras, including repeated

engagements with the National Symphony Orchestra in Washington DC. His performance with the NSO on the Capitol Lawn for an audience of 50,000 prompted the Washington Post to declare, "If Shih is as gifted in medicine as he is in music, he has some serious career decisions to make." Other past orchestral engagements include the Georgetown, Ann Arbor, University of Michigan, New England Conservatory, Harvard-Radcliffe, Newton, and Paris Garde Republicaine orchestras.

In 1997 Christopher was one of the top four Americans in the Tenth Van Cliburn International Piano Competition, where he was a press and audience favorite. Christopher is also the grand prize winner of the 2006 Washington International Piano Artists Competition, the 2007 Boston International Piano Competition for Exceptional Amateurs, and the 2008 Paris Concours des Grands Amateurs de Piano. Christopher is a board-certified gastroenterologist practicing in Maryland, received B.A. from Harvard and M.D. from Johns Hopkins. He currently lives in Ellicott City with his wife and two daughters. He frequently collaborates with his wife, who is a violinist on faculty at the Peabody Preparatory Institute in Baltimore.

Jelena Vladikovic born in Belgrade, Serbia, immigrated to Vancouver, Canada. She holds the B.M. and M.M. in Piano Performance from Belgrade and the University of BC in Vancouver. Scholarships for academic and performing excellence took her to some of the world's most eminent teachers: Evgeni Timakin, Moscow Central Music School, Pavel Serbryakov, The

Rimsky-Korsakov Music Conservatory in Leningrad, Guido Agosti, Academia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia in Rome, and Robert Silverman, University of British Columbia. Jelena began her concert career at age 15 after winning 1st place at the most prestigious Yugoslav piano competition. She played in Europe and Canada and appeared on radio and television. Retiring from performing to devote herself to her young son, later she embarked on a new career in journalism and PR. Inspired by her 2007 WIPAC win, she went back to piano and began her D.M.A. studies in Piano Performance/Pedagogy at the ASU School of Music and started teaching again. National Music Certificate Program recently awarded her the Founding Teacher designation for her contribution to "establishing a national standard for developing musicians in the US." She recently became a member of the NMCP and Royal Conservatory of Music.
